From the Headmaster

As we get ready to head down the home stretch of the 2009-2010 school year, I would like to take this time to express my personal appreciation for the efforts and sacrifices you parents and guardians have made for your children, as well as to highlight a few of the improvements and changes we will be implementing for the 2010 summer school session and the 2010-2011 school year.

In the academic realm we have many exciting happenings for the 2010-2011 school year. We will again partner with the University of South Carolina to offer college/university courses for college credit to select seniors and juniors. Currently we offer English 101 and 102, Math 111 and 122, Sociology 101, Psychology 101, History 111 and 112, Economics 224 and Political Science 201. We are in the process of reviewing the textbooks and curriculum guides for all of our academic courses and they will be updated as needed. Starting with the 2010 summer school session, we will be adding the TE 21 A+ Learning System to our academic program. The A+ Learning System will benefit our students in a variety of ways. It will afford us the opportunity to do more detailed assessments of students in the areas of mathematics and English and will give us a better understanding of where a student's academic shortcomings are as well as to allow us to better place students in courses. With the A+ System, we will also be able to offer more differentiated instruction and add alternative learning environments for our cadets. The A+ program will also benefit us in our after-school learning labs as well as providing SAT and ACT practice.

On the military/leadership front, we will be adding and continuing some things that we hope will aid in the character development of your young men. We will once again hold the "Spartan Challenge" during the first part of the 2010-2011 school year. We will also bring in speakers on motivation and leadership. Next year, I will be teaching a course in leadership and motivation, based on the principles of Zig Ziglar and Dale Carnegie. The course will focus on leadership and self-improvement. I am excited to be able to return to the classroom. The course will first be available to our Battalion Staff, with plans to eventually expand it to more of our cadet corps.

We have been working hard to make improvements to our campus. Our renovation to the White Field House is nearing completion. New walls, paint, lighting, stage curtain, carpet, gym floor and bleachers are part of our renovation. We will start on the locker rooms and weight rooms this summer.

I believe that we have achieved some great things this year but I am really excited about what we have planned for next year. From now until graduation we are on a fast track. We want to finish strong as well as have our eyes on the future.

Camden Military Academy Dual Enrollment

Since 2006, Camden Military Academy cadets have had the opportunity to earn credit in both high school and college while taking courses from the University of South Carolina in the Dual Enrollment Program.

The primary purpose of offering dual credit courses is to deliver high-quality experiences to high-performing high school students. Dual credit courses are suitable to challenge students who are mastering the high school curriculum and who require college-level course work that is more rigorous than high school curriculum. Dual credit courses enrich and extend the high school curriculum and provide introductory college coursework. The courses promote gradual transition to the college work load and give students a jump-start on college. Cadets must be 11th/12th grade students and must have at least a 3.0 GPA. A teacher's recommendation prior to enrollment is also required. Dual credit courses carry an honors weight. The courses currently offered include the following:

- Economics 224 – Introduction to Economics
- English 101 – English Composition
- English 102 – English Composition and Literature
- Government 201 – American National Government
- U.S. History 111 – Before 1865
- U.S. History 112 - 1865 to the Present
- Mathematics 111 – Basic College Mathematics
- Mathematics 122 – Calculus for Business Administration and Social Sciences
- Psychology 101 – Introduction to Psychology
- Sociology 101 – Introduction to Sociological Facts and Principles

This year we have over 40 cadets participating in the program. A number of our graduating seniors will leave Camden with 30 credit hours. Next year we have plans to expand our program.

Questions and Answers with 2007 CMA graduate and current Citadel cadet Bailey Hansil who was a 1st SGT in A Company.

In addition to the seasonal sports, we have bowling, the drill team, and the rifle team that compete throughout the school year.

Admissions

This is a very busy and exciting time in the admissions office. Re-enrollments have been mailed, new applications are coming in, and the summer programs offered by CMA are just a few short months away. Therefore, I would like to share a few happenings of the admissions office.

I am excited to announce a new tuition program called the Tuition Guarantee. This program allows a family to freeze the current tuition until the time the cadet graduates. In other words, the academy's tuition may rise, but yours will not as long as you meet the limited criteria (please see the separate article for full details!) In order for current cadets to be eligible for the current year tuition plan, a re-enrollment application must be returned by April 30, 2010. This will lock the current tuition of \$17,595.00 for as long as your son attends CMA.

Re-enrollment for the 2010-2011 school year has begun. Re-enrollment applications were mailed in late February to the cadet's home address. If, for some reason, you did not receive your re-enrollment application, please contact us so that we may provide one. It is important to return your son's re-enrollment as soon as possible, so that the academy knows of your intention, and so that those returning cadets receive their promotions for next school year.

Camden Military's summer program will include summer school for high school students, academic enrichment camp for middle school students as well as a 5 day outdoor adventure camp. Registration for all three programs is underway. So if you know of a student who may be looking to earn some credit this summer or is just looking to have a good time, please ask them to consider Camden.

This newsletter is presented to you for the first time to inform parents and relatives of our young men in the CMA Corps of Cadets of the latest happenings and upcoming events around the campus.

NEW TUITION PROGRAM ANNOUNCED

Camden is pleased to offer parents the Tuition Guarantee. This new program allows a family to "lock in" the current tuition rate as long as their son continually enrolls at CMA as well as meets all deadlines for re-enrollment and tuition payments. Therefore, if the academy raises tuition, your tuition would remain the same as it was the first year that you enrolled your son in the program. In order for current families to be eligible for the Tuition Guarantee, your son's re-enrollment application must be received in Camden Military's office by April 30, 2010.

CMA Band News

Band members at CMA are eligible to participate in the South Carolina Region 3 Honors Band at either the Junior (grades 7-8), Clinic (grades 9-10), or the Senior (grades 11-12) levels. Once registered, the student plays an audition consisting of a required solo, scales, knowledge of musical terms, and is asked to sight-read. Judges then compute a composite score, and the top-scoring musicians are seated as an All-Region Honors Band. The highest scorers in each instrument from each of the state's 5 regions are invited to another round where the All-State Band members are selected.

Participation at CMA is strongly encouraged. Over the years, several musicians have won placement in the Region 3 Honor Band, and one former cadet has won the distinction of selection for the All-State Band.

Cadet Austin Heard, 9th grade trumpet player from Band and Staff Co., was selected to represent Camden Military Academy at the South Carolina Region 3 Honor Band Festival and concert on February 26 and 27th at Rock Hill. Cadet Heard successfully completed a rigorous audition process and was chosen from several hundred other trumpet hopefuls from a seven-county area to play in this select band. This large concert band rehearsed intensively for two days under the direction of a noted professional conductor and presented an exciting concert.

Civil Air Patrol

Camden Military Academy's Civil Air Patrol squadron has held weekly meetings featuring professional instruction (by a Certified Flight and Ground Instructor) in aerodynamics, meteorology and the airport environment. Other instruction has included training in leadership, moral character, Drug Demand Reduction, communications and safety. Guest speakers have included recruiters from all four branches of the military. Earlier this year members attended a weekend air show exhibiting some of the world's best aerobatic pilots and demonstrating some of the latest military tactics.

Major DeCandia, Squadron Executive Officer, has recently qualified as a Civil Air Patrol Command Pilot and Cadet Orientation Pilot. On March 6, 2010 he took six squadron cadets on their first orientation flights in a Cessna 182Q four-seat airplane. Each Cadet took a turn in the front seat and had the opportunity to control the aircraft during straight and level flight. In the CAP Cadet Program, each member is eligible for five powered flights. Major DeCandia's certification will enable us to expose cadets to aviation in a way never before possible.
