

Camden Military Academy Dual Enrollment 2019-2020

Camden Military Academy high school students have the opportunity to earn credit in both high school and college while taking courses from the University of South Carolina and Central Carolina Technical College. Our Dual Enrollment program does come with an additional fee. For more information, please call LTC John Heflin at (803) 432-6001.

- The primary purpose of offering dual credit courses is to deliver high-quality experiences to high-performing high school students.
- Dual credit courses are suitable to challenge students who are mastering the high school curriculum and who require college-level course work that is more rigorous than the high school curriculum.
- Dual credit courses enrich and extend the high school curriculum and provide introductory college coursework.
- Dual credit courses promote gradual transition to the college workload.
- Dual credit courses give students a jump start on college.
- Cadets must be an 11th/12th grade student.
- Cadets must have a minimum 3.0 GPA and teacher recommendation prior to enrolling.

*Each cadet must agree to all of the classroom and academy rules. If a cadet becomes a behavioral problem, he will be permanently removed from the class. Additionally, he will receive a “WF” and no refund will be given.

The CMA (High School) grade is ten points higher than the U of SC (college) grade.

- **Dual credit courses receive 1 GPA boost.**

Course Descriptions

BIOL 110 – General Biology

Credits: 4

Basic biological concepts and issues for non-biology majors. Credit may not be given for both this course and BIOL 120.

Note: Three lecture, two laboratory hours per week.

MATH 111 – Basic College Mathematics

Credits: 3

Basic college algebra; linear and quadratic equations, inequalities, functions and graphs of functions, exponential and logarithmic functions, systems of equations. Credit may not be received for both MATH 111 and 115.

Prerequisites: placement through Algebra version of the Mathematics Placement Test: <http://assess.math.sc.edu/>

MATH 115 – Precalculus Mathematics

Credits: 4

Topics in algebra and trigonometry specifically needed for MATH 141, 142, 241. Subsets of the real line, absolute value; polynomial, rational, inverse, logarithmic, exponential functions; circular functions; analytic trigonometry. Credit may not be received for both MATH 111 and 115 or both MATH 112 and 115.

Prerequisites: C or better in MATH 111 or 111I, or by Precalculus Placement Test: <http://assess.math.sc.edu/>

Economics (ECON) 224 – Introduction to Economics.

Credits: 3

Micro and macroeconomic principles of markets, government policy, and household or firm decision-making.

English Language and Literature (ENGL) 101 – Composition

Credits: 3

A course in the composing process with attention to invention, arrangement, and style, and closely supervised practice in reading and writing essays.

Cost: \$375.00

English Language and Literature (ENGL) 102 – Composition and Literature

Credits: 3

A course in the writing of expository and critical essays with an introduction to literature and including a research paper.

Prerequisites: ENGL 101

Government and International Studies (GINT) 201 – American National Government

Credits: 3

The formation and development of the national government, its organization and powers.

Cost: \$375.00

History (HIST) HIST 101 – European Civilization from Ancient Times to the Mid-17th Century

Credits: 3

The rise and development of European civilization from its Mediterranean origins through the Renaissance and Reformation.

Cost: \$375.00

History (HIST) HIST 102 – European Civilization from the Mid-17th Century

Credits: 3

European development and expansion from the mid-17th century to the present.

Cost: \$375.00

History (HIST) HIST 111 – United States History to 1865

Credits: 3

A general survey of the United States from the era of discovery to 1865, emphasizing major political, economic, social, and intellectual developments.

History (HIST) HIST 112 – United States History since 1865.

Credits: 3

A general survey of the United States from 1865 to the present, emphasizing major political, economic, social, and intellectual developments. Honors sections are available for students in the honors program.

Criminal Justice (CRJU) CRJU 101 – The American Criminal Justice System

Credits: 3

Survey of crime and societal responses to crime, including law enforcement, court, corrections, and the juvenile justice system.

Psychology (PSYC) 101 – Introduction to Psychology

Credits: 3

An introduction to and survey of the basic concepts and findings within the field of psychology.

PCAM 205 - Foundations of Leadership

Credits: 3

This course combines leadership theory with practical application, equipping students with the knowledge and skills needed to work more effectively with people, become better leaders, and reach their professional goals.
